

HIGHLIGHTS & ACHIEVEMENTS

- Eliminated overdue fees to help increase materials checkouts and improve library accessibility for all
- Offered a variety of COVID-safe programs featuring in-person outdoor events, virtual offerings, and take-home activities for children and teens
- Modernized our website, adding an email newsletter and a new library calendar where patrons can reserve the community meeting room and register for events completely online
- Increased library visits by 79% and increased circulation of materials by 40% over the previous year
- Added all editions of the Rappahannock Times from the 1950s to our online newspaper archive, available through our website
- Increased participation in the Summer Learning Program across all age categories
- Completed a study of our library building with the architects at Enteros Design that will help guide the Library Board of Directors in updating or expanding our current facility
- Logged 6,645 books read as part of the 1000 Books Before Kindergarten program









COMMUNITY CONNECTIONS

Everything we do is centered around our community. With a focus on respect, accessibility, and excellence, we maintain a welcoming and engaging attitude both within our library and beyond its walls.

- Strengthened our partnership with Rappahannock River Valley National Wildlife Refuge through seasonal Storywalks and special events at the Refuge's Hutchinson Tract.
- Partnered with the Tappahannock-Warsaw Moose Lodge to host a Fiction Writing Contest for Essex County Youth with a total of 33 submissions.





- Distributed over 1,500 books through our three **Little Library Boxes** located throughout the county. We also worked with local student groups to hold book drives to fill the boxes. With help from some awesome volunteers, new materials are regularly added to each box.
- **Circulated Wi-Fi hotspots** to help bridge the digital divide in our community.
- Hosted young volunteers as part of summer VolunTEEN program.


